## ANCESTORS

A. ZVI HERSCH Hacohe LAUTERBACH, of priestly descent, lived towards the end of the 18th century either in Drohobycz or in a place called Lauterbach somewhere in Germany or Austria. Mentioned briefly in "Minḥat Erev" (Essay "Eyn Yaacov") by his grandson Ascher Selig (3) as "the celebrated and distinguished scholar, Godfearing and benevolent, the prince of his people". ∞ HANNA (See *Memoir*).— 3 children.

A. 1 MOSHE LAUTERBACH \* 7. Adar [year unknown]. Mentioned in the introduction to the Essay "Eyn Tappuah" in "Minḥat Erev" by Ascher Selig.— Died childless.—

A. 2 HAYA BINA LAUTERBACH \* [?]. △ 4. Nissan 5602 (1842).—A Jewish matron, whose memory, name and example lived long in the family (See *Memoir*), ∞ [—] EISEN, a devout man who spent his years in prayers and studies while his wife was looking after the earthly needs of the home. (See above *Memoir*). They left no children.—

A. 3 JACOB BEZALEL (Zallel) LAUTERBACH. The founder of the Drohobycz family. \* [Lauterbach, Germany] 1800. Lived in Drohobycz as distributor of salt, a monopoly of the Austrian State. A patriarchal figure, a learned and pious man, whose house, according to his son's, Asher Selig's "Autobiography" "was open to all who needed friendship or warm-hearted comfort and was frequented by the learned and God-fearing members of the community". After the death of his first wife left for Palestine 1865 with his second wife and settled in Safed.—△ Safed 7. Adar 5630 (10.III.1870) (See *Memoir*).— ∞ I RAHEL MANDEL (d. David Mandel) \* Buczacz [1802]. At the early age of fifty she became an invalid and, nursed by her two youngest daughters, bore her sufferings patiently, until she succumbed to progressive paralysis. A moving description of her illness and death is contained in the epitaph her son Asher Selig set her in his homily "Eyn Behi" in "Minḥat Erev". Her last request was to be buried on the outskirts of the cemetery, so that her sons who, being of priestly descent, could not enter the burial grounds, might be able to approach her grave.—△ Drohobycz, 2. Adar 5620 (25.II.1860).— 10 children. ∞ II [1864] [Name unknown].—

ZVI HERSCH LAUTERBACH \* [Drohobycz] 1818, lived in Drohobycz. A quiet, God-fearing man of a retiring disposition (see *Memoir*), △ Drohobycz 11. Sivan 5640 (21. v.1889).—Ⓢ EIDEL MALKA GINZBURG (d.Israel Ginzburg), \*Buczacz, △Drohobycz 12. Nissan 5641 (11.IV.1881).— 6 children.

1. 1 Abraham ABEL LAUTERBACH \* Drohobycz 1834, lived in the family house in Drohobycz, first as owner of a wine shop, later as cashier in a local bank. A cheerful, good-looking man with tidy side curls, dressed in traditional garb of Galician Jews. △ Drohobycz 14. Kislev 5657 (19.XII.1896) of heart failure. Ⓢ TAUBE HERZBERG (d. Schmelke Herzberg) \* Rudki 1838. An observant, agile and ever-active woman, greatly preoccupied with her family. L. Drohobycz. During First World War fled to Vienna. △ Vienna 29. Shebat 5677 (23.I.1917).— 9 children.

1. 11 PINKAS LAUTERBACH \* Drohobycz 9. Tebet 5616 (16.[17?]XII.1855.—Educ. in traditional Heder and by private teachers in Hebrew, German and general knowledge. Worked in private firm, then in Drohobycz Municipality, 1889 in brewery in Andrychów and from 1890 in Przemyśl as bookkeeper and chief official in the "propination", the holders of monopoly for spirits, the biggest business concern in town.—1910/33 worked on his own in the same trade. Spent two years of the First World War in Vienna. 1933 left for Palestine and stayed with his eldest daughter Ecia Knoller. An observant, but tolerant Jew, a highly esteemed member of the Jewish and general community (see *Memoir*). Lived to celebrate his diamond wedding. △ Haifa 10. Kislev 5698 (14.XI.1937), buried in the New Cemetery (part A, row 32, No. 504).—Ⓢ [Przemyśl] 8.VIII.1876 Haya ANNA PROBSTEN (d. Izhak Baruch Hacohen Probstien Ⓢ Esther Malka Stieglitz) \* Przemyśl 20.X.1856 (21. Tishri 5617). Educ. convent school, lived best part of her life in Przemyśl. 1933 moved with husband to Palestine. A woman of sweet nature, goodness and wisdom. (See *Memoir*). △ Haifa, 11. Tamuz 5700 (17.VII.1940). Buried in the New Cemetery (Part A, row 53, No. 1353).— 8 children.

1. 111 EMANUEL (Mendel) LAUTERBACH (p. Munio) \* Przemyśl, 9.VI.1878 (8. Sivan 5638), merchant.—Address: 500 West 235 Street, New York 63, N.Y.—Educ. high school Przemyśl, Univ. Lwów, Academy of Commerce, Vienna. 1903-1934 partner in the firm Joe Lesti Nfg. wholesale distributors of American typewriters in Vienna. After liquidation of firm worked on his own. 1938 came to Israel and settled in Tel-Aviv as owner of lending library. 1956 emigr. U.S.A.—Ⓢ Vienna 13.III.1913 MARGARETHE (Grete) REICHSTHALER (d. Heinrich Reichsthaler Ⓢ Alvine Mendelsohn, granddaughter of Eleazar Halevy Ish Horowitz, Chief Rabbi of Vienna), \* Vienna. L. Vienna, Tel-Aviv, New York.— 1 child.

1. 1111 HERBERT GEORGE LAUTERBACH \* Vienna 17.VIII.1920, Ph.D., B.S.—Address: 1510 Delaware Ave., Wilmington 6, Delaware.—High School, Vienna, 1938, emigr. London and 1939 U.S.A.—Grad. Lehigh Univ.,

Bethlehem (B.S. Chem. Eng.)—During Second World War employed in U. S. Government research. Awarded Certificate by Office of Scientific Research and Development. Grad. Massachusetts Institute of Technology (Ph.D.).—Since 1949 Research Supervisor with F.I. DuPont de Nemours & Co., Wilmington, Delaware.—

1. 1141 JUDITH ALISAH LAUTERBACH \* London 8.II.1926 (24. Shevat 5686), B.A.—Educ. King Alfred School, Golders Green, London. July 1940 left with mother and sister for Canada; 1941 immigrated to New York U.S.A. There attended Dalton and Walden School; 1943/47 Smith College, Northampton, Mass. Grad. (with honours) 1947, majoring in history. From October 1947 London, worked as Secretary of the Zionist Youth Federation and studied Anthropology at the London School of Economics. 1948 visited Italy and 1949 Israel. 1950 earned the Academic Postgraduate Diploma in Anthropology of the London University on the strength of her thesis on "SOME CONCEPTS OF STATUS AND AUTHORITY PATTERNS ON A COLLECTIVE SETTLEMENT IN ISRAEL". Was again in Israel in 1950 and decided to settle there; went back to Europe to settle her affairs; on the way from Paris to London died in air-accident.  $\Delta$  London 31.X.1950 (21. In Great War 1914/18 medical officer in Austrian army, and during Polish-Russian War 1919/21 in Polish army. 1921 settled as physician in Przemyśl.—Zionist from childhood, chairman of Jewish National Fund Commission in Przemyśl. 1932 left with family for Palestine. L. Tel Aviv and from 1934 Haifa as children's specialist at the Workers' Sick Fund (Kupath Holim).—A man of supreme integrity, an observant Jew, an upright, kind-hearted person and a conscientious physician, respected and adored by the parents of his numberless child-patients. (with honours) from a commercial school in Tel Aviv and passed London matriculation. 1947 joined the mounted Jewish Settlement Police. Fought in the Jewish War of Liberation and fell in the battle of Tantura against Egyptian invaders.  $\Delta$  Tel Aviv 25.V.1948 (16. Iyar 5708). Buried in the Nahlat Itzhak military cemetery. A memorial stone for him and his 12 comrades has been erected in Tantura.—
1. 118 ISABELLA (DZIUNIA) LAUTERBACH \* Przemyśl 9.X.1904, B.Sc.—Elem. school Przemyśl, high school Vienna and Przemyśl. Brilliant student. At school joined the Zionist youth movement "Hashomer". Grad. Export Academy, Vienna and London School of Economics (B.Sc.(Econ.)). From 1929 assistant secretary Zionist Executive, Organisation Department, London, from 1936 to 1944 Jerusalem. 1944 moved to Belfast, 1945 settled in Swansea, South Wales. Active in the local Women's Zionist Organization (Wizo) as cultural chairman, in the Swansea Women's Discussion Club and other local societies. A young woman of many accomplishments and of singular charm (See *Memoir*).—Ailing since 1955, died 1957, of cancer.  $\Delta$  Swansea 21.VIII.1957.— $\odot$  Jerusalem 27.X.1944 DAVID CLEMENT ROSSER JOHN \* Swansea 27.III.1907, Gentile. 1939/46 served with British Army in Palestine, Turkey and Northern Ireland; 1946 discharged with the rank of Lieut. 1. 122 JOSEPH (Joe) MENKES, \* Drohobycz 7.I.1887. Address: 1155 Simpson Street, Bronx, N.Y.— 1910 emigr. U.S.A. Retired from catering business. ☉ New York 14.III.1917 LENA GROSSMANN (d. Jehoshua and Taube Grossmann) \* Lwów 20.I.1890.—
1. 13 JACOB LAUTERBACH (p. Kuba) \* Drohobycz 17. Tebet 5620 (12.I.1860). Educ. Drohobycz, probably the first male in the family to attend a non-Jewish school. Studied law at the Czernowitz (Chernowtsy) Univ. Became official of the General Post Office in Austria (K. K. Postdirektion), Vienna, and lecturer in postal geography. Published a text-book on the subject. Retired with the rank of Court Counsellor (Hofrat). He was a good-looking, sociable, jovial person. △ Vienna [1940].— ☉ Lwów [1890] SABINA EHRLICH (d. Jonas Ehrlich) \* Lwów [1865]. △ Vienna 1933.—
1. 14 Israel ISIDOR LAUTERBACH \* Drohobycz 28. Elul 5621 (3.IX.1861). L. Drohobycz and worked in office. △ Drohobycz, [1925]. ☉ I. PEPI LITTMANN, \* Kalisz. Died young of tuberculosis. △ Drohobycz [1890].— 2 children.  
☉ II TONI ATLAS \* Jarosław. A stern stepmother. Under Nazi occupation took her life to escape persecution. △ Drohobycz [1942].— 1 child.
1. 141 CECYLIA LAUTERBACH (p. Cyla). \* Drohobycz [1887]. Educ. Drohobycz. A tall, black-eyed, fair-looking girl, subdued and pensive. Had a sad childhood, owing to harsh treatment by her stepmother, and a tragic end. The unhappy young woman fell in love with her uncle, Matthias Geller (1.19) and eloped with him to Vienna, a stirring and disturbing event in the placid life of a conventional respectable family. Predisposed to chest trouble, she fell ill and died young of pneumonia. △ Vienna [1911].—
1. 142 LITTMANN LAUTERBACH \* Drohobycz [1890]. Sent by his father to Vienna as an apprentice to a locksmith. Served in the Austrian army, lost a leg and died soon afterwards. A victim of hereditary tuberculosis and stern treatment by his parents. △ [Vienna 1920].—
1. 143 MALWINA LAUTERBACH \* Drohobycz [1895]. L. Drohobycz as secretary in a law office. Murdered by Nazis. △ Drohobycz [1942].—
1. 15 Freida FRIEDA LAUTERBACH (p. Frydzia) \* Drohobycz 6. Tishri 5685 (6.X.1864).— △ Żyżnomierz [1926]. ☉ JOSEF FÜLLENBAUM \* [1860], farmer in Żyżnomierz near Buczac. △ Żyżnomierz [1928].— 3 children.

Hochschule für Welthandel, Vienna, and College of the City of New York. 1923 emigr. U.S.A.—Executive assistant in New York company.—⊞ New York City 14. VIII.1926 ROSE GLAZER (d. Aaron Glazer ⊞ Sarah Schneider) \* Proskurow, Russia 6.I.1902. Attended Univ. of Odessa. Left Russia 1920.— 2 children.
