

This SUPPLEMENT the compiling of which I have undertaken at the request of the LAUTERBACH FAMILY BOARD in Israel is intended to contain a full record of all events that have taken place in our larger family since the issue of the CHRONICLE in 1961.

It will, accordingly, embody both the information conveyed in the earlier two SUPPLEMENTS (No. I of August 1962 and II of September 1964) and also a record of events that have occurred after September 1964. It presents therefore a continuation of and a sort of second volume to the original CHRONICLE and should be treated and perused as such.

As will be seen from the STATISTICAL SUMMARY, printed on the page overleaf, which summarizes the changes that have occurred in the main aspects of the family status in the period since the publications of the CHRONICLE (in 1961), the total *number of members of the family* (descendants and their spouses) has increased by 73 from 930 to 1003.

The *number of living relatives* has grown by 41 and amounts now to 488. We may be justified in the hope that this growth will continue steadily and that our old family will enjoy a long and lasting life.

On the other hand we must earnestly face the fact that among that significant group in our family composed of those male *descendants, who bear the LAUTERBACH family name* the deplorable tendency has regretfully been maintained towards a steady diminu-

tion of its numbers, from 78 to 34 in the period until 1691* and from 34 to 32 since then**.

If this sad decline continues its fateful course, one must fear that the time-honoured name of the LAUTERBACH family may in future be borne by a gradually dwindling number of its descendants. May they bear it with dignity and pride, and by the standards of their lives add to the glory of our ancestral heritage.

I wish to conclude by expressing the hope that in years to come further SUPPLEMENTS to our CHRONICLE will be issued, to keep pace with developments in our larger family and to help maintaining the bonds of affinity and cohesion among its present and future generations.

Generation" in Table 2 (p. 158 of the CHRONICLE). Accordingly, the total sum of 33 "Bearers of the LAUTERBACH family name" (p. 159 line 6*) should have read 34.

** The number of 34 members in the year 1961 has since sustained a loss of 4 by the decease of 3 members of the third generation (1.45, 3.45, 6.34) and one (1.111) of the fourth. This decrease has been partly only compensated by the birth of 2 sons, one of the fifth (3.4511) and one (1.31213) of the sixth generation.
